Administrative support and a commitment by SWAT Command & Team Leaders

- Must fully understand and accept their roles and responsibilities.
- Liability: SWAT supervisors become "K9 supervisors" when a K9 team is deployed under their supervision during a tactical operation or trains with the tactical team.

Selection process

Who do you pick? Do you have a say?

- Handler(s)
 - Team player / PFQ / Peer input
 - Ability to <u>control</u> the dog
- Dog(s)
- Trainer(s) and/or Instructor(s)



STEP 5 – **EQUIPMENT & UNIFORMS**

CA POST & NTOA recommend basic safety equipment for handlers deploying with SWAT recommended. [SAME!]

- Explain integration process
- Introduce K9 team(s)

K9 team orientation

- Discuss the liabilities and risks associated with deploying a police dog in a tactical operation
- How dogs work; nose, ears & eyes
- A demo; observe dog(s) work and begin to learn how they will best serve the team
- Sociability and familiarization drills
