Curriculum/Lesson Plan

Course Objective: To provide students with a Tactical Debrief regarding the Marcus Schumacher Domestic Incident which occurred on February 10th 2016 in which Fargo Police Officer Jason Moszer was killed. The incident details, tactical response and lessons learned will be discussed.

Specific Objectives:

1. To make students familiar with the incident specifics to include the initial patrol response, the SWAT response and the resolution of the incident.
2. To make students familiar with the decision making process during the incident
3. Discuss the response following the incident to help officers cope with the loss of an officer

Terminal Performance Objectives:

1. At the conclusion of the training session, students will have an understanding of this particular call for service and what transpired from the initial call to the resolution of the incident.
2. Students will have an understanding of the decision making process utilized and what was learned from this incident that can improve a law enforcement response to similar calls in the future.
3. Students will have the knowledge of how to properly handle the aftermath of a major incident so that the officers involved are taken care of mentally and emotionally.

Method of Presentation: Lecture with Powerpoint and audio clips

Students: Law Enforcement Officers, SWAT Teams

Classroom Requirements: Tables and chairs for students, computer and PowerPoint projector, screen and ability to play audio from the computer.
